Frequently Asked Questions

What does it mean when I hear the outdoor warning sirens?

- In short, it means that something is happening and you should get more information using radio, television, or social media.

What should I do when I hear the outdoor warning sirens?

- You should receive more information from NBG social media or other Mass Warning devices.

Why can't I hear the outdoor warning sirens in my house?

- Sirens are an outdoor warning system designed only to alert those who are outside that something dangerous is approaching.

When are outdoor warning sirens tested?

- Sirens are tested on the first Tuesday of each month at 3:15pm. Inform NBG Emergency Management if you cannot hear the outdoor test.

Will the outdoor warning sirens warn me of every dangerous situation?

- Sirens are only one part of a warning system that includes email, telephone, text, NOAA Weather Radio, and local media.

Who activates the outdoor warning sirens?

-Sirens are activated by Naval Base Guam Emergency Management, Andersen AFB Command Post, and Guam Homeland Security Office of Civil Defense.


Why does Guam have a common guideline for sounding outdoor warning sirens?

- When threatening situations happen, minutes or even seconds could make a difference. If people are unsure or confused about an alert, they may not respond quickly or appropriately. By adopting common outdoor warning system guidelines, confusion will be eliminated, response time will be reduced, and lives will be saved. Guam, the Navy and Air Force Bases have adopted a common protocol for sounding their outdoor warning systems (sirens).

To "Shelter-in-Place" means to go inside immediately. Make sure that everyone in your family knows the safest place to be in your home during an emergency. Put as many walls between yourself and the outdoors as possible. Close and lock all doors and windows. Close the drapes or shades. Stay away from windows.

If instructed to do so, eliminate ways in which outside materials may enter the shelter, including shutting off ventilation or climate control systems, and prepare an area for pets to eliminate waste that does not require allowing them outside.
